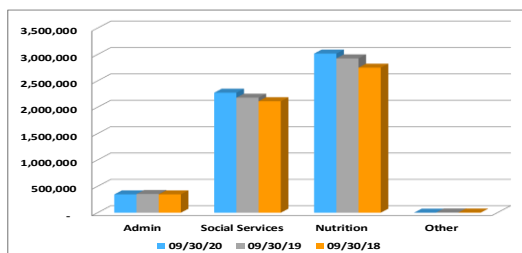

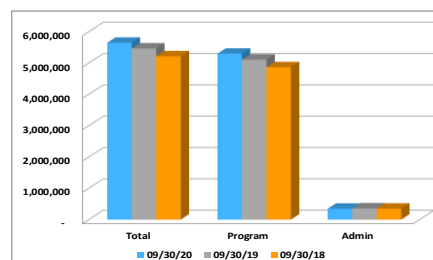

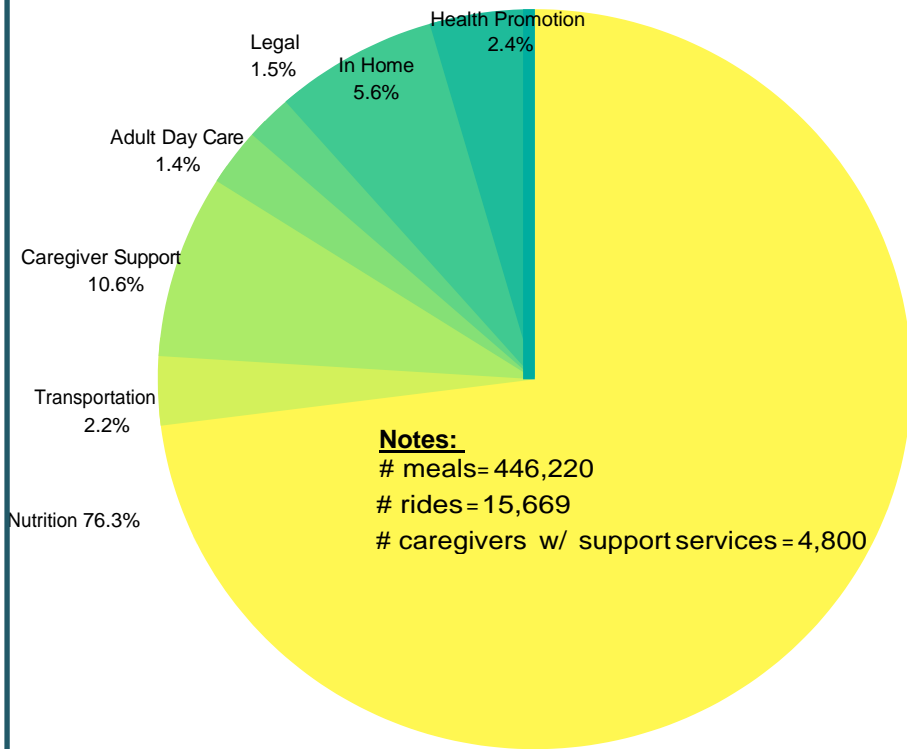

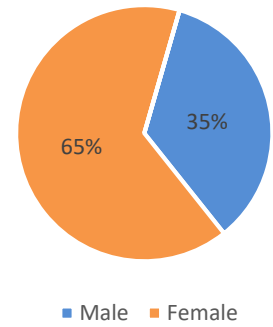

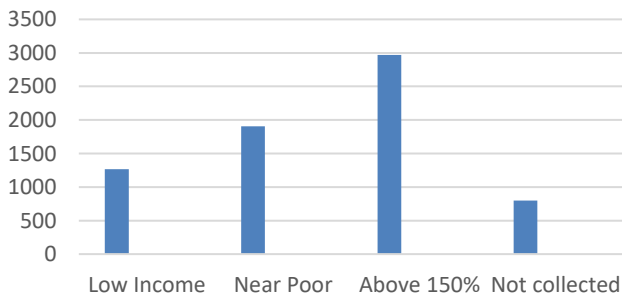

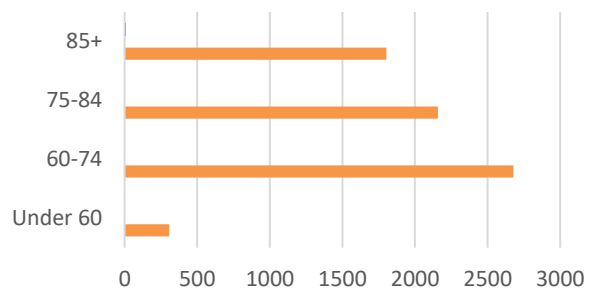
Gender of Consumers FFY'20



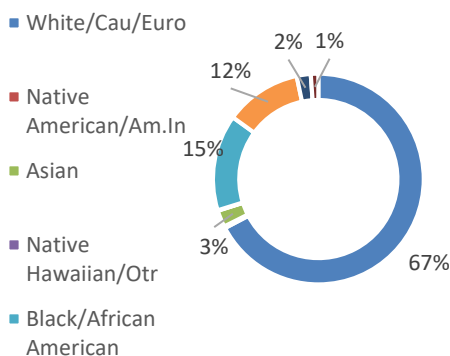
Income Level of Consumers FFY'20
